

DAVIS COMMUNITY MEALS 2008 FACT SHEET

Meals Program

- Served 6,512 meals to 392 unduplicated low-income and homeless men, women and children.

Shelter and Transitional Housing Programs

- Provided emergency shelter to 145 homeless men and women.
- Provided cold weather shelter to 66 homeless individuals.
- Provided transitional housing to 39 adult men and women.
 - ✓ 23 became employed
 - ✓ 8 began receiving a public benefit, for example SSI (Supplemental Security Income)
 - ✓ 23 moved into permanent housing

Family Transitional Housing Program

- Provided transitional housing to 17 homeless families consisting of 17 adults and 33 minor children.
 - ✓ 10 parents became employed
 - ✓ 5 began receiving some form of public benefit
 - ✓ 8 families moved into permanent housing

Resource Center/Day Shelter

- Provided services to 945 low-income and homeless individuals and families.
 - ✓ 510 adults and 435 children

Cesar Chavez Plaza Permanent Supportive Housing

- Provided permanent supportive housing to 17 formerly homeless individuals.
- Provided permanent supportive housing to 25 individuals with special needs.

Transitional Housing Plus

- Provided transitional housing for six former foster youth aged 18 to 25.
